**Renewal of Profession Promises** 

For our last meeting, fourteen members of our fraternity joined our brothers and sisters from Holy Spirit Fraternity in Claremont at the Our Lady of the Assumption Church. During Mass, those of us who were professed renewed our profession promises. After Mass, we gathered in the auditorium to share a potluck meal. A video by Brother Bill Short provided ongoing formation. Small group discussion followed the video. It was a beautiful day filled with companionship and community. As we left to go home, the Lord decided to renew our baptisms as well, and the skies opened up, we all got water poured on our heads. Perfect joy!





St. Paschal Baylon's parents were poor people who were devoted to their faith. The family was Spanish. From the time he was seven Suntil the age of twenty-four he worked as a shepherd. During this time, he began a life of mortification. He could pray on the job, and listened for the church bell which rang at the Elevation during Mass. An honest person, he once offered to pay farmers for any damage his sheep had caused to their crops.

In 1564, he joined the Friars Minor and gave himself to a life of penance. He was urged to study for the priesthood, but chose to remain a brother. He served as porter, cook, gardner, and official beggar.

Paschal was careful to strictly observe his vow of poverty. He would not wast food or anything given to the friars. As porter, he cared for the poor coming to the door and was known for his generosity. His brother friars tried to moderate his liberality.

He spent his spare time in praying before the Blessed Sacrament. Many people sought his wise counsel. After his burial, people flocked to his tomb. Miracles were reported promptly. He was canonized in 1690 and was named patron of eucharistic congresses and societies in 1897. His memorial is celebrated on May 17<sup>th</sup>.
