#### Preparing to be Servant Leaders

".... Together with all the members, you now pledge yourselves to spend your efforts to make the fraternity a genuine ecclesial assembly and a living Franciscan community." Rite of Profession, page.22.

We pledged to spend our efforts to made the fraternity... "a living Franciscan community." During the Rite of Profession, we each responded on three occasion. "Yes, this is what I want." Also during the Rite of Profession, we prayed for Divine Grace. I here personalize the prayer which you will find in Ritual of the Secular Franciscan Order at page 23.

O Lord our God Your grace has led me your servant to live my faith more fully in the context of this world by my profession of the gospel according to the life and Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order. By the power of the Holy Spirit may I give witness to the life and teaching of your Son to all the world. Grant that I may be continually united to Christ through the gift of my life, In order that the Church may be rebuilt and her mission be fulfilled through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The pledges and prayers in our Rite of Profession become reality for each of us in fraternity when we have leaders who guide and animate us. Two of the duties of the Regional Executive Council as found in the General Constitution of the Secular Franciscan Order Art. 62:2 are:

e. to provide for the formation of those responsible for animation

f. to offer to local fraternities activities which support their formative and operative needs

The Regional Executive Council's response to these mandates is to provide opportunities for workshops, seminars and more extensive weekend programs that prepare our members for Franciscan leadership. Preparation for Profession into the Secular Franciscan Order required time and commitment. Being a Secular Franciscan requires time and commitment. The preparation of Professed members who will guide and animate us requires time and commitment. We can make excuses like the would-be follower of Jesus recorded in Luke 10:59 "[Lord,] *let me go first and bury my father.*" Luke 10:61 *"I will follow you, Lord, but first let me say farewell to my family at home.*"

We can each come up with many reasons why we are not ready to animate and guide our brothers and sisters in fraternity. We will never be ready if we do not open ourselves to the workings of the Holy Spirit and take advantage of the opportunities presented to us.

Can we say with conviction "O Lord our God your grace has led me your servant to live my faith more fully in the context of this world by my profession of the gospel according to the life and Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order" when we do not take the time to prepare ourselves for the time when we may be called to animate and guide our brothers and sisters?

## **CHAPTER NOTES**


The Chapter, a Fraternal and Pastoral Visit, with the Regional Fraternity was held at Best Western Inn Suites, Ontario, CA from January 13 -15, 2017. The Visitors were Joan Geiger, OFS. National Councilor and Br. Alexander Escalera, OFM, Cap. President in Turn of the Conference of National Spiritual Assistants.

**Friday Evening:** The fraternity ministers met to discuss what they wished to see in the region's newsletter *Joy of Francis* and on the region's website. They used large post-it sheets to 'brag' about your (fraternity) activities in 2016. The Regional Executive Council (REC) met with the Visitors.

**Saturday:** Morning prayer was a Remembrance for members of the three Orders. Joan led the group in Ongoing Formation. Members of the Regional Fraternity, Observers and Spiritual Assistants, minus the REC, met with the Visitors. Representatives of the Geographic Districts met to plan their district activities for 2017. Members of the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> Orders were present.

National and St. Francis Region Archivist, Sharon Deveaux, OFS, made a Power Point presentation on what fraternities need to archive.

The Region has initiated a status for members who are homebound or live a distance and are connected to but unable to attend the monthly gathering. Effective year ending 2017, those members will be considered "emeritus." They will continue to receive TAU-USA and will pay ½ of the Region fair share. At 2016 National Fraternity Chapter, the Region was given permission to formulate a document and pilot it on a trial basis. We are preparing the document.



Bob Herbelin, OFS and Cyl Maljan-Herbelin, OFS, who have relocated out of the Region, were recognized and roasted for their contributions to the Region over many years.



**Sunday**: Morning prayer was for Christian Unity. The Regional Fraternity approved a balanced budget for 2017. Five students from the last Spiritual Assistant/Formator Class received their Certificates of Completion. The Chapter concluded with Mass, celebrated by Fr. Stephen Gross, OFM, Conv.

## REGIONAL SPIRITUAL ASSISTANTS


Eight spiritual assistants are currently working on the class Syllabus with the objective of having it available as soon as possible, but no later than sometime in May. Sorry – I can't give you a definite date. It is a massive job but we're working on it as hard as we can.

Because the week-end classes are limited in size (due to the capacity of the retreat center where the week-ends will be held), a different procedure is necessary in order to have a class in June, all of whom are totally committed to completing the entire program, which is estimated at this time to be a total of six weekends. There is a maximum number the retreat center can hold, and they also have a minimum number required for a week-end. Therefore, we will not be able to say anyone can come who wishes, and have perhaps 35-40% drop out over time, as we have in the past. Here's the way the application process will work. An application with an accompanying list of instructions will be sent to each minister in the Region. After discussion and discernment by each fraternity's entire council, the council is asked to give the application to a fraternity member whom the entire council can recommend for the program. The application, when completed by the member, will be returned to his/her council, who will send it back to us (name and address for the return will be included with the original application and letter) with the council's letter of recommendation. An interview will be conducted with each applying individual before acceptance into the class. There may be more than one recommended applicant from a fraternity, and we will take all that we can, with the limits of the center and the format of the classes in mind. We will try to have all six week-end dates available for you as soon as possible; we must first confirm them with the retreat center.

The Leadership Training program is for everyone who may someday be elected to a council, appointed to a local or regional fraternity position, or chosen to become a local spiritual assistant. It is not a change in the program that has been given in monthly classes for the last 12 years, but an addition, modification, and hopefully, improvement on that class content and presentation method. Please know that as we have visited fraternities around the region, we have been very gratified to see the great extent to which those who have previously attended the Spiritual Assistant/Formator program have helped improve formation in their fraternities. That improvement has been continuous and has resulted in a great upgrade in the quality of both initial and ongoing formation throughout the region. To that extent, you are doing exactly what the Order and the Church expects of us all, in better learning to live the Gospel life. Thank you and keep it up!

Los Angeles County: 30<sup>TH</sup> Anniversary St. Francis Fraternity



#### Address by Fr. Christopher Theil, OFS, Cap. At the 30 Anniversary Celebration Of the Saint Francis Fraternity

I am so grateful that we have a chance to thank God for the blessings we have received over the last 30 years. I also can't help but remember St Francis' Last Testament. He left his words with us as the gift that we inherited from Him. We can echo his own grateful words that the Lord has given us brothers and sisters. We are gifted with a Fraternity that can remind us of what is important, and what is not. A Fraternity that can inspire us, comfort and encourage us. A Fraternity that calls us to inspire, comfort and encourage others.

Among his last words was a call to renewal, "Let us begin again, for until now we have done nothing." Even in 1226 people could have argued with Francis, listing out the dozens of things that they have done to change the lives of so many. But I suppose St Francis was afraid that looking back too much might tempt us to rest and feel justified like one of the Pharisees that Jesus warned us of. Perhaps there is a danger that we could be tempted to stop our own conversion, or our renewal of the Church, that is still falling into ruin.

I hope as we celebrate, we take the time to treasure those who were among us and are now with the Lord. We give thanks for having known so many who have shown us how to let the Lord into our hearts. We thank the Lord for the gift of our vocations, and humbly ask for the grace to be faithful to our call. We are confident that the Lord will work through us to help others discover their own vocations. We witness how the Church is renewed one soul at time, but that soul is never alone. God has been so good to us! Let us courageously share what we have received!
